

Listening for digraphs: Ask your child to read aloud the sound made by the digraph in the middle circle (or read it aloud for him). Ask him to name each picture and draw a line connecting the digraph to each word that contains it.

The central circle contains the digraph **nk**. It is connected to six surrounding circles, each containing a different image:

- Top: A chain with a padlock. A red arrow points to one of the links.
- Top-right: A volcano with smoke and lava.
- Right: A hand with a red arrow pointing to the knuckle.
- Bottom-right: A blue car with the word "HONK!" written twice above it.
- Bottom: A blue cup of coffee with steam rising from it.
- Left: A golden bell.

Tip for parents: Look in a picture dictionary with your child and ask him to find all of the words that end with *nk*. There may be some interesting ones to find and discuss, such as *wink* or *clank*.
